



**STUDY GUIDE:** February 15, 2026

Message Series: What Did I Just Sing?  
Message Title: The Lord Will Provide  
Teaching Pastor: Angie Frame

**Warm-up/Icebreaker:** (10 min.)

Did you ever sing the wrong lyrics to a song for years before realizing it? Which song? OR What's a song from your teenage years that you still know every word to? Music shapes us. Just like those songs shaped us, the songs we sing in church shape what we believe about God. This will be a great series together.

**Pray:**

Father God, Thank You for bringing us together and for the opportunity to open Your Word and learn from You. We invite Your Spirit to guide our conversation. Give us understanding as we read, humility as we listen, and courage to apply what we learn. Teach us more about who You are and shape us into people who reflect Your love in our daily lives. In Jesus' name, Amen.

**Get Started:** (30 - 40 min.)

*"In this series, we will look at four songs and unpack the theology within them—what they say about who God is and what he does. We will also look at the Biblical basis for them. Because no matter how much we like a song, if what it says about God isn't based in Scripture, then it isn't worth singing. In fact, it could lead us astray in what we believe to be true of God.*

*We want you to know that you can come to church with confidence that the music we're doing—whether it's a style you like or not, whether it's at a volume you like or not—it is founded on the Bible. It is true of God. So, you can come, listen, sing along, and all the while, get to know God, yourself, and our world better. We're starting with the song, "The Lord Will Provide." -Pastor Angie Frame*

- When you hear "The Lord will provide," what does that actually mean to you?

**Read Luke 12:22–34.**

- Why do you think Jesus connects God's provision with a warning against greed?
- What do flowers, sparrows, and ravens teach us about God?
- How do you personally reconcile "The Lord will provide" with the reality of poverty and hunger in the world?
- Have you ever experienced God providing — but in a way you didn't expect?
- Where is it hardest for you to trust God's provision right now?

**Reflect and Commit:** (30 min.)

**Read Exodus 16:11–20.**

- Why do you think the manna rotted when people tried to keep extra?
- In our culture, where do you see the temptation to stockpile, hoard, or over-accumulate?
- How has God used someone else to provide for you?
- How might God want to provide for someone through you right now?

*“We seek the kingdom; we seek Jesus, His ways, and His will for our world. That’s where we put our focus. When our attention and our hearts are focused on the kingdom of God, then we are NOT focused on meeting our own basic needs. God will work through us to provide for the poor. When our attention and hearts are focused on the kingdom of God, then we are NOT focused on building up our treasures or bank accounts on earth, but on building up treasure in heaven. The kind of treasure that can’t be stolen or destroyed. The treasure of knowing God and getting to be part of his work to make his kingdom come and his will be done on earth as it is in heaven.”*
