Message Title: His Kingdom Come
Teaching Pastor: Angie Frame

Warm-up / Icebreaker (10 min.)

What is something small that ended up having a much bigger impact on your life than you expected?

Pray:

Heavenly Father, thank You for inviting us into Your kingdom. Thank You that You are always at work, even when we cannot see it. Open our hearts today to understand more of Your will and Your purposes. Help us trust Your timing, embrace the work You are doing within us, and live as people who help Your kingdom grow. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Get Started (30 min.)

- When you think of God's kingdom, what images or ideas come to mind?

Jesus often used simple stories to explain the kingdom of God. In these parables, He compared the kingdom to a mustard seed and yeast—small, ordinary things that produce extraordinary results.

Read Matthew 13:31-33.

- Why do you think Jesus chose such small and ordinary things to describe His kingdom?
- What does this teach us about how God often works in our lives?

Pastor Angie reminded us that the kingdom of God is often unexpected and unassuming, but incredibly powerful.

Read Luke 4:43.

- Why do you think understanding God's kingdom was such a central part of Jesus' mission?

Reflect and Commit (30 min.)

One of the key lessons from these parables is that the growth of God's kingdom takes time.

Read Galatians 6:9.

- Can you think of an area where God has grown you gradually over time?

Pastor Angie shared that the kingdom is designed to grow—not only in the world, but in every part of our lives.

Read Philippians 1:6.

- How does this verse encourage you when you feel like you're not growing fast enough spiritually?

The mustard seed became a tree where birds could find shelter. The kingdom grows not simply to become larger, but to make room for others.

Read Matthew 13:32.

- What do you think it means for God's people to create space where others can belong?
- What is one small step you can take this week to help God's kingdom grow in your life or in the life of someone else?

"There's no room for barriers around race, money, education, gender, politics, county lines, campus lines. The kingdom of God will grow to people of all colors, of all countries, to people with lots of money in investments and no money in the bank. It will grow to people who have advanced degrees and to people who can't read and write. It will grow through men and women, teenagers, and kids. The kingdom will grow to reach Republicans and Democrats and everyone in between. To those in prison and those in every town and county in central Virginia. To people in every campus of PCC. It doesn't matter which one. What matters is that the kingdom is growing. Not so that PCC can be big. It's not about being the biggest or best; it's about being home to the worst. The forgotten. The unwanted. That's what the kingdom of God is like. That's what PCC tries to be like, and has tried to be like from our very first days to this day. We are ordinary, unassuming, unexpected people. We are doing our best to live out the kingdom of God right here, right now. So that everyone around us can come to know Jesus. Then once you come to know Jesus here, you're part of the movement." - Pastor Angie Frame
